### Minutes

#### Call to Order and Welcome

The Public Awareness Committee (“Committee”) achieved a quorum and convened at 4:33 PM. Present were Chair Ryan Hudson, Sue Randolph, Anne Cross, and Gary Perkins. Linda Wilkinson was not present when the Committee convened but arrived at 4:35 PM. Ellen Bowyer (Senior Assistant County Attorney, Hanover County Attorney’s Office) and Ivy Sager (Executive Director, Hanover County Community Services Board) also were present.

The first order of business was to approve the proposed agenda and the minutes from the August 15, 2022, Committee meeting. The Committee approved the minutes and agenda as presented.

#### Jean C. Harris Award – Closed Session

Ms. Randolph offered the motion to go into closed session pursuant to subdivision (A) (11) of Section 2.2-3711 of the Code of Virginia for discussion of the qualifications of the nominees for the Jean C. Harris award. The Committee approved the motion unanimously. The Committee thereafter was in closed session. The Committee came out of closed session and voted unanimously to certify the session at 4:53 PM. The Committee then voted unanimously to approve both nominees for the award, and Mr. Hudson stated that he would present the matter to the full CSB Board.

#### New Business

Ms. Cross reported that Scotchtown had offered to give a private tour of the premises to the full Community Services Board on a Thursday in October; the Committee proposed October 20, 2022, at 10:00 AM. Mr. Hudson asked that Ms. Cross raise the matter with the full CSB Board to determine the most suitable date for the tour.

Mr. Hudson raised again the idea of a scholarship for high school students. Ms. Bowyer noted that she had been planning to undertake research to assess the question but had not yet done so, and that she would share her findings as soon as the research was complete.

Mr. Perkins asked whether space in the Hanover Review could be dedicated to the CSB. He noted that it was difficult to find the announcement about the Harris Award and believed it would be valuable to expand the CSB’s footprint in that publication. The Committee agreed that the CSB Board Chair could approach the County Administrator regarding this matter.

Ms. Wilkinson noted that she had attended a meeting of the Randolph Macon College Board of Trustees and in the course of some discussions, sensed there might be a lack of awareness of resources relating to student mental health. Ms. Sager observed that the CSB serves the College and that the CSB has an ongoing relationship with the College, including training and guidance supplied to Resident Administrators. The Committee discussed the importance of behavioral health services.

The Committee then reviewed the invitation and program for the Jean C. Harris Award and approved the draft prototype.

The Committee adjourned at 5:21 PM.
